#### LETTER FROM THE MINISTER

Hi

Isn't it funny how we so easily see things from our own perspective and even when we get the chance to see it from another angle, we can't always change. For instance, when I'm cycling, I expect drivers to treat me with respect and give me adequate space when passing (highway code says 1.5m). I get cross when drivers cut me up. However, when I'm driving, I get frustrated when a cyclist gets in my way and is slowing me down and I might curse under my breath. When I'm in one head space I can't always see things from another angle, even when I have experienced things from that other angle.

And so, I think it might be the same with our church life. We all say things and do things at times from a position of emotional dysregulation, ie we are cross or frustrated or hurt.... Such actions in themselves hurt others and we don't see it. And we need others to point it out, not again out of pain, or revenge or hurt, but with a sense of love that we all need to be and do things differently, because we all need to be more Christlike and we cannot do it on our own.

When Jesus faced the crowd that were about to stone the woman caught in adultery, (John Chapter 8) he stopped proceedings and allowed others to see the situation from another angle and then calmly wrote patterns in the sand to allow everyone space to reflect, non-judgementally. And so, this is where I think we need to be as a church, to acknowledge we have got things wrong, to see things from a different perspective and then to help each other become more Christlike. I too am sorry the times that I get things wrong and look at things in my short-sighted way, for whatever reason. We all need to strive to see things not just from the other's perspective, but through the eyes of Jesus, and pray that we can all move towards being that little bit more Christlike each day.

Only write the address on the Gift Aid envelope if you are a tax payer. If you donate one hundred pounds you must have paid £25 in income tax during the year; two hundred is £50 in tax, etc. If you haven't paid enough Income Tax then the Tax Office will ask you to repay that sum of money.
